1. Do research on bookplates and print images of the ones you would like to use as reference or because you like them. Post these in your book with annotation.




2. Look up heraldry and uses images of heraldic designs with your own notation.



3. Collect and post images in your book of things that could represent you. These could be: musical instrument, ornamental flowers or trees, symbols, animals, mythological characters, any ornamental imagery you like, a sports object, flag, etc.







4. Practice some ornamental ribbons and banners:
